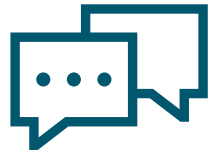
# Death & Dying Fellowship

## What You'll Learn

This Fellowship takes on a key challenge: the reality that professionals are not well prepared to deal with or talk about death, dying, and grieving families. You'll learn, confront, and discuss the legal, medical, social, cultural, familial, and spiritual aspects of death and dying within a multidisciplinary group in a low-pressure environment. The sessions include opportunities to practice conversation skills and participate in site visits.
